Residents in Mobile's Transitional Homeless Program January - June 2022

- 35% fleeing domestic violence
- 24% grew up in foster care and/or has never been independent
- 17% could not maintain reliable childcare
- 12% were stably housed until landlord refused to make necessary repairs
- 6% had a health care crisis and drained emergency savings
- 6% struggling with addiction
- 70% of residents who are able to work were employed when they entered the program

THE RESPONSE: *"...whatever you did for one of the least of these, you did for me."* - Matthew 25:40

Baldwin Family Village (BFV), Baldwin County's first transitional housing program for homeless women and children - The BFV is more than a safe refuge for residents. It is a proven program steeped in accountability. Each resident is engaged in a holistic plan for restored hope and personal transformation, breaking cycles of abuse and despair.

THE PROGRAM: *"Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people."* - Galatians 6:10

- To be operated by Dumas Wesley Community Center (DWCC), which has been recognized nationally for its expertise in working with the poor and addressing homelessness since its founding in 1903
- DWCC operates a transitional housing program, Sybil Smith Family Village with an 88% success rate, significantly higher than the national average
- Residential accountability is critical to the program's success: mandatory life skills classes, covenant to remain drug and alcohol free, work and/or education requirements

THE PROGRESS: *"My Father is always at his work to this very day, and I too am working."* - John 5:17

- Baldwin Family Village Foundation established as the fundraising arm of BFV
- \$1.46M raised in less than 10 months to purchase the facility and secure first year of operating expenses
- Sustainability Goal: raising \$540,000 annually for years 2 and 3
